With a workforce of almost **48,000** in Edinburg alone and more than **364,000** across the larger metro area, fueled by strong universities and colleges, this region is home to a vast pool of skilled talent.

LOW COST OF LIVING

As the **county seat** of Hidalgo County, Edinburg serves as the administrative center of the larger region. This unique position gives Edinburg an advantage within local government.

The University of Texas Rio Grande Valley (UTRGV) enrolls **32,000+ students** across various fields of study, from nursing to mechanical engineering. UTRGV has the **largest Hispanic enrollment** in the state of Texas and has the **lowest student debt** in Texas.

Location & Transportation Assets



In the heart of the Rio Grande Valley, Edinburg is an ideal location for business. The Greater Edinburg region contains a seaport, space port, 12 international bridge crossings and four railroads within 80 miles.

Located off Interstate-69, Edinburg is connected to other business hubs in the north like San Antonio and Corpus Christi. Edinburg connects to the rest of the U.S. through a network of major highways.

Edinburg's Growth



- Of cities with 100,000 or more residents, Edinburg is the 12th fastest-growing in the country and 6th fastest-growing in Texas
- Fastest-growing city in the Rio Grande Valley, 30% growth (2010-2020)
- Edinburg is the **third largest city** in the Rio Grande Valley
- Edinburg has the largest school district in Hidalgo County



Edinburg partners with UTRGV, South Texas College, and local companies in the private sector to train students for specific jobs. UTRGV's **Professional Education** and Workforce Development department offers multiple programs to prepare talent for the workforce.



Edinburg has also created a strategic partnership with **Workforce Solutions** to bring training programs, career coaching and talent development resources to residents in key occupations. The **E3 Program** connects youth with career resources and focuses on empowering, educating and employing young talent in Edinburg.

Incentives

Edinburg Economic Development Corporation has different incentives for qualified businesses looking to relocate.

Job Grants: These grants include permanent full-time, veteran/special needs, employer-sponsor training, and internship opportunities.

Tax Refunds: Applicants may request refunds of property and sales taxes paid to the City, based on job creation and capital investment.

Infrastructure: The City and the EDC may consider investing in infrastructure or other improvements on behalf of a project if the investments would improve the competitiveness of the impacted area overall in terms of attracting future development or result in other benefits to the community.
